



Materials

Yarn

TOV DK by WOOLFOLK 100% Merino 160 yards / 50 grams, 1 skein of each color

Color

Main Color TDK04,

Contrasting Color TKD14

Needles

US #6 / 4mm double pointed needles OR 40"+ circular needle (for the magic loop method) or size needed to obtain gauge

Stitch markers

Tapestry needle to weave in ends

Gauge

20-21 stitches / 32-34 rows = 4"

Finished Measurements

24"/60.98 CM circumference at top opening

Scrunch Cowl

Stitch Abbreviations

K=Knit

P=Purl

PM=Place Marker

SM=Slip Marker

Scrunch = allow next stitch (a knit) to drop off the left needle, and unravel it for 4 rows, so that there are 4 "ladder rungs" above it. Put your right needle into that stitch from front to back, and knit through that stitch. After you complete the stitch, you'll see that all of the "ladder rungs" are also caught up in the stitch, creating the scrunch

5 loose strands below next st, purl these 5 strands tog with next st on needle

Wrap Stitch = Work until stitch to be wrapped. On the RS: bring yarn to back of work, sl next st purlwise, return yarn to front, return wrapped st to left hand needle. On the WS: bring yarn to front of work, sl next st purlwise, return yarn to back, return wrapped st to left hand needle.

Cast On

CO 120, join round, place marker to note beginning of round

Set up Row: Knit

Section One

With Main color

Rows 1 - 5: *P2, *K1*, repeat between *s to marker

Row 6: P2, *allow next stitch (a knit) to drop off the left needle, and unravel it for 4 rows, so that there are 4 "ladder rungs" above it. Put your right needle into that stitch from front to back, and knit through that stitch. After you complete the stitch, you'll see that all of the "ladder rungs" are also caught up in the stitch, creating the scrunch*, repeat between *s to marker

Repeat rows 1 - 6 : Four times

Section 2

With contrasting color, wrap first st, turn work, and slip marker.

Note: You will now be working on the wrong side (WS). The wrapped sts do not need to be picked up later.

Row 1 - 5: *K1, P2*, repeat between *s to marker

Row 6: P2, *allow next stitch (a knit) to drop off the left needle, and unravel it for 4 rows, so that there are 4 "ladder rungs" above it. Put your right needle

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into that stitch from front to back, and knit through that stitch. After you complete the stitch, you'll see that all of the "ladder rungs" are also caught up in the stitch, creating the scrunch*, repeat between *s to marker.

Repeat rows 1 - 6 : Two times

Section 3

With main color, wrap first st, turn work, and slip marker.

Note: You will now be working on the right side (RS). The wrapped sts do not need to be picked up later.

Row 1 - 5: *P2, *K1*, repeat between *s to marker

Row 6: P2, *allow next stitch (a knit) to drop off the left needle, and unravel it for 4 rows, so that there are 4 "ladder rungs" above it. Put your right needle into that stitch from front to back, and knit through that stitch. After you complete the stitch, you'll see that all of the "ladder rungs" are also caught up in the stitch, creating the scrunch*, repeat between *s to marker.

Repeat rows 1 - 6 : Four times

Bind-off

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
